SCHOOL

Brewster Madrid, the first international branch campus of Brewster Academy in Wolfeboro, New Hampshire, opened in 2023. It is the first in a network of schools growing across Spain and Europe. This year, Brewster has also opened a satellite campus for grade II-I2 students called the Pre-University Hub, also located nearby in Chamberí. Additionally, for 2025-2026, Brewster opened another K-II campus in La Moraleja, Madrid. With its new IB authorization at their Chamberi campus, they will also begin their journey of offering the IB curriculum alongside the US and AP curriculum it has offered since 2023. Brewster Madrid operates in partnership with Brewster Academy, which was founded in I820 and is accredited by NEASC as is Brewster Madrid, with an additional authorization by the Spanish Ministry of Education. Students have opportunities to take classes at the campus in Wolfeboro, New Hampshire, during their studies, utilizing the world as their classroom. The school has an enrollment of over 400 students in K-I2 across both campuses, comprising 45+ nationalities and a graduating class of over 55 seniors. All instruction is entirely in English.

MISSION AND VALUES

The mission of Brewster is to prepare diverse thinkers for lives of purpose. Brewster believes that understanding students empowers them to understand themselves, to seek out new challenges, and to embrace learning in community. Brewster graduates display our core values of being caring, curious, creative, and persistent in their pursuit of purpose.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Brewster students enroll in a minimum of 24 classes (6-7 per year), although many graduate with more. Students take the following courses annually: English, math, science, social studies, and foreign language. Most of our students are fluent in 2+ languages. Brewster also has a wide variety of electives that students enroll in outside of these core classes, and grade 9 students enroll in PE. During senior year, students may elect to concentrate on an additional subject of their choosing in lieu of another subject (for example, a second science in place of one social studies). Lastly, all students take a fine art course. All students are enrolled in after school programming involving participation in clubs, athletics, and/or a sports team. All students undertake an advisory class covering social-emotional learning throughout the school year.

ACADEMICS, RANKING, & GRADING

Brewster Madrid offers an American Curriculum with AP Courses. Currently, II AP courses are taught across all subject areas with I4 total in rotation. Brewster's Chamberí campus has received IB authorization to begin offering IB courses for the 25-26 school, and will be offering a small number of courses in each of the 6 IB categories. It is important to note that Brewster does not offer every IB subject, and both full IB Diploma students may enroll in the IB as well as American High School Diploma students wanting to enroll in an individual course; an IB HL course is recognized at the same level as an AP course. Brewster Madrid, in line with Brewster Wolfeboro, does not have a class rank.

As for grading, Brewster Madrid reports a percentage grade that denotes the degree of mastery of the disciplinary content and skills. GPA is calculated using a quality point system that reflects the instructional grouping the student has worked in for each of their courses with additional weighting for AP and IB courses. The cumulative unweighted GPA is on a 4.0 scale and the cumulative weighted GPA is on a 4.33 scale. The transcript will distinguish an unweighted and weighted GPA for each student. IB students will receive both predicted scores on a scale of 7 as well as letter grades and a GPA for each course. They will also receive both an IB Diploma and a US High School Diploma upon passing all their courses. The average SAT for Brewster Wolfeboro in previous years was: EBRW 54I and Math 58I.

COMMUNITY & EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING

Brewster Madrid continues to be a trailblazer in experiential learning stemming from the Wolfeboro campus. They host many weeklong, hands-on learning experiences throughout the year, offering students opportunities that range from winter hiking and dogsledding to game design and digital photography to studies of food insecurity and gender equality. Classes, excursions, and numerous immersive experiences (including international exchanges) that allow students to interact with others in languages other than their own, help foster students' sense of global awareness and appreciation for multiple perspectives. In turn, this helps ensure they are ready to tackle university and the world beyond high school.

AP RESULTS 2025

Out of the 20 AP subjects taken in 2025, Brewster Madrid students achieved:

77% pass rate across all courses and exams

75% higher performance than the world average

pass rate on 8 exams
